Spalding: In order to learn all 70 phonograms by the end of the year, we are now going to introduce 2 new phonograms per week. Our new phonograms this week are ed(3 sounds: ed, d, and t) and dge (1 sound: "j")The phonograms we will be reviewing this week are: ow and oo.

We will also be reviewing the first 2 of 5 jobs of the letter "e".

- 1) First job of e makes the vowel say its name (time).
- 2) Second job of e: English words don't end in "u" or "v".

We will also be reviewing spelling rule 26: Capitalize proper nouns (People, Place, Things).
