We will continue to learn about how changing the first letter of a word changes the meaning of a word. We will also work on rhyming words, sounding out 3 & 4 letter words and constructing sentences. **Please keep reading to your child at home.** The more contact they have with the text, the better!

Handwriting: Write a,c,d,f,g,o,s,qu correctly starting at 2 o'clock. Encourage your child to begin at 2 on the clock and go up and over the rainbow. We will continue to work on writing all phonograms. Please practice letter formation at home also.
