Spalding:

Reading: We have story time each day where we read picture books and beginner books. We discuss elements of narratives like character, setting, main idea and sequence of events. We will continue to learn about how changing the first letter of a word changes the meaning of a word. We will

also work on rhyming words, sounding out 3 & 4 letter words and constructing sentences.

Please keep reading to your child at home.

The more contact they have with the text, the better!

Spelling : We are off to a great start on spelling. Each Monday your child will come home with a list of words in their folder. These words stay at home so they can study with you. The test will be on Friday each week. We are writing our words in our Spalding Notebooks and constructing sentences as a group using these words. We will be practicing them every day, but the students will need to practice these at home each night.

Handwriting: Write will encompass all letters. Encourage your child to begin at 2 on the clock and go up and over the rainbow to form any clock letters. Remind the students that we never begin a letter from the bottom line. We also are working on staying on the bottom line and writing neatly. Please practice letter formation at home. The students need practice.

Math- We will be learning the following: Math games, partner groups and whole groups: Number recognition 1-60; counting objects 1-30; number sets, following directions; left/right; same / different;

inside/outside; on/off; pennies, nickels and dimes and patterns. We have started addition and will continue practicing.

Science - We will look again at habitats and the things that live in each system.

Social Studies - Our World - The globe as replication of earth. The planets and sun around us.
