Hello to Franklin 3rd -grade parents and students!

I am very excited to be your child's teacher this year, and have a lot of fun activities planned for us to do while we are learning.

Our classroom theme is "beach" and you will feel very comfortable in our beach classroom.

Our class procedures are very similar to those last year, but this year, it is extremely important for students to not share supplies and to not be too close to the other students. We do expect your third graders to be quiet when we are teaching, raise their hand to speak, get up, or go to the rest room. Also, no poking or bothering other students. Students will see their name on the board for doing something they know they shouldn't be doing (talking in class instead of paying attention to the teacher), a checkmark by their name earns a 5 minute loss of recess time, and two checks is 10 minutes off of recess and possibly a call home. I do have a reward system in mind for those who try their best to learn and do their best in class!

Home Work

For spelling words, we are reviewing words that were learned last year to get back into spelling again. We are reviewing phonograms a-z this week too. There are spelling words and phonograms to write the first three days of the week, and then there is a word-find puzzle for Thursday.

Reading is a one-page short story Monday - Thursday this week. There are questions at the end of each story, but the answers should be easy to find. *Please read the questions before reading the story; it may make the answers easier to find.* There is a fun paper for Friday.

The math worksheet is review, and will probably be very easy for your student, but I'd rather have the students reviewing everything before we get into new material.
